







Difficulty Rating (Out of 10): 3 (The game board is a simple and optional construction but it is an ideal way to constrict playing size for tabletop gaming)

Recommended Duplications: 9 (I have found that a game grid consisting of nine tiles is the ultimate size for morphing tabletop dungeons. It doesn't take up too much room yet it offers enough space to build a complex dungeon section. The other more obvious benefit is that your floor tiles will never warp or move around on you.)

Steps:

- Cut where marked. Cut the optional border trims through the black cut lines.
- Purchase an inexpensive sheet of foam-core approximately 28 by 22 inches.
- Glue the nine floor tiles down to the foam-core starting from the upper left corner. Be sure to apply a thin but well spread coat of glue on the back of the tiles. Apply smoothing strokes to each tile to remove any air bubbles and to distribute the glue underneath evenly.

- Cut away any excess foam-core from the edges with a large straight edge.
- Apply the border trim as noted in the above photos.
- As a final touch you may want to make a straight cut down the center of your board.
 Apply a strip of duct-tap along the back. This will make your board foldable and more importantly "transportable".

That's it! Your friends will think you blew a huge chunk of cash on some elaborate new RPG game.
