

Buildings of the World Series England Big Ben

"Big Ben" is commonly used to refer to the clock tower at England's Houses of Parliament, and is a familiar symbol of London. "Big Ben" is actually the name of the 13.7-ton bell suspended inside the tower, which is named Saint Stephen's Tower. This huge bell rings every hour, while a smaller set of bells rings every fifteen minutes. These bells continue to announce the correct time to the people of London.

















HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT 2 - ROOF






HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT 1 - ROOF




HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT 3 - ROOF
