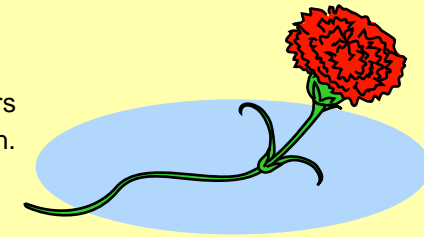




Mother's Day (second Sunday in May)

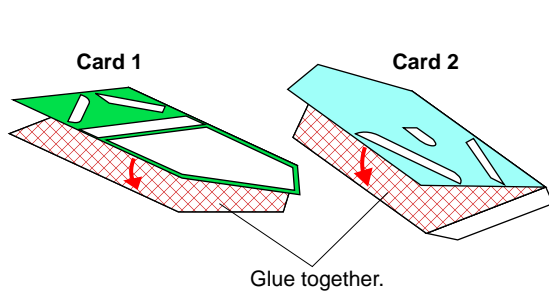

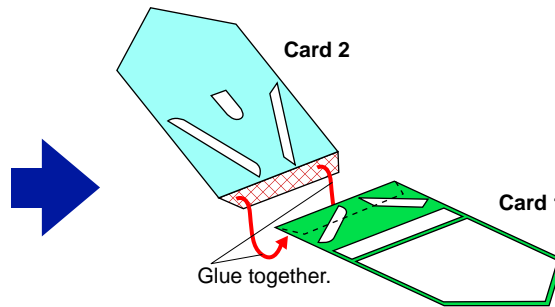
Flowers are a way of saying, "I love you, Mom!"

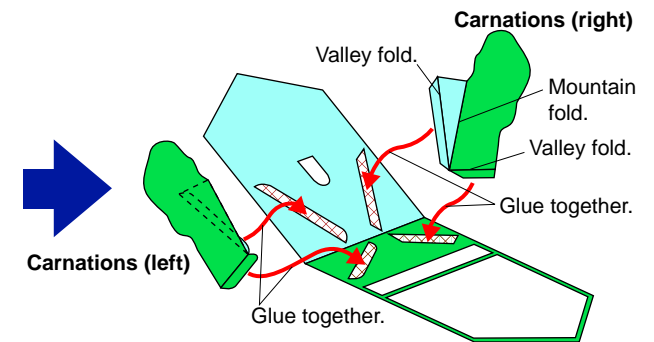
1. Build Card 1 and Card 2.



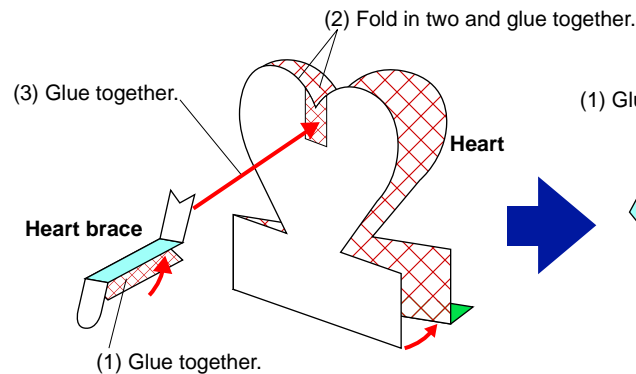
2. Glue Cards 1 and 2 together.



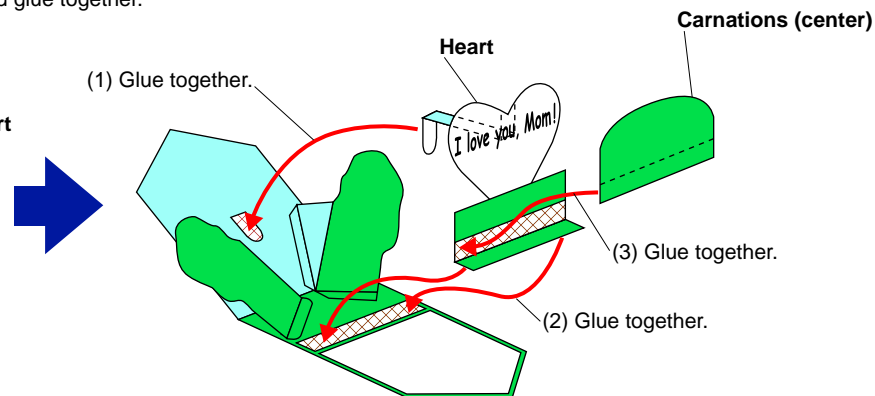
3. Glue Carnations (left) and Carnations (right) to the card.
